
#### INSTALLATION

qualified person in accordance with applicable standards in the country concerned.












#### INSTALLATION


The solenoid valve is mounted on the watertap. Ensure the gasket is intact in the tube and the tube from the Water Tap is mounted on the valve outlet, the arrow on the back of valve indicates the water direction.





 Connect the solenoid valve to the plug with the orangeyellow cable pair. Ensure the plug is inserted the right way up. The orientation surfaces on the plugs must point in the same direction.





#### INSTALLATION HEIGHT



#### IMPORTANT!

- Ensure easy access to maintenance and cleaning of the unit.
- It is recommended to ensure easy access to cut the power before cleaning and maintenance.
- Do not bend the hose too sharp. It will reduce the water supply.

#### PRODUCT APPLICATION

- · Place hands approx. 2-12 cm under the water tap sensor to activate the water flow
- · Remove hands after hand washing
- · Stops automatically when hands are moved away

#### **CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE**

Routine cleaning and maintenance is recommended every 12 months. This may be required more frequently depending on the local conditions.

#### **CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE OF TAP/SENSOR**

- · Do not rinse with running water
- Use a damp cloth and mild cleaning solution. Never use cleaning detergents with an abrasive effect.
- · Clean sensor for dust and dirt to prevent unintentional activation

# **CALIBRATION OF SENSOR RANGE**

- Cut the power
- Connect power to the water tap
- Place your flat hand close to the sensor until the blue light on the front of the tap turns off and starts flashing red (this should be done immediately after the power is turned on)
- · Move your hand to the desired activation distance
- When the tap flashes quickly, move your hand close to the sensor again and keep it there until a blue light activates
- The calibration setup has completed with the new distance and the product is ready for use




# TROUBLESHOOTING AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

SYMPTOM	CORRECTIVE ACTION		
No water coming from tap	<ul> <li>Ensure power is on. A solid blue light indicates the tap is ready for use.</li> <li>Ensure water supply to the tap. Ensure the hose is not bent or twisted</li> <li>Check the IR sensor for dirt, clean if necessary.</li> <li>Cut power to the product, wait for 10 seconds and reconnect. When the blue solid light comes on, it is ready for use.</li> <li>You could try to calibrate the sensor range (see section for sensor calibration, page 9)</li> <li>Contact DAN DRYER A/S if none of the above options work (see back page).</li> </ul>		
Constantly running water from tap	<ul> <li>Ensure power is on. A solid blue light indicated the tpa is ready for use.</li> <li>Check guideline for location of tap relative to sink (see installation point 1 &amp; 2, page 5)</li> <li>Check the IR sensor for dirt, clean if necessary.</li> <li>Cut power to the product, wait for 10 seconds and reconnect. When the blue solid light comes on, it is ready for use.</li> <li>You could try to calibrate the sensor range (see section for sensor calibration, page 9)</li> <li>Contact DAN DRYER A/S if none of the above options work (see back page)</li> </ul>
